



- 24 Baruch Maoz is working hard on a book dealing with hermeneutics, and requests that we pray he will be thorough and understandable without dumbing down the content.
- 25 The Korties (Native Amer., AZ) give thanks that although the nursing home and detention center on the reservations are still not open to programs, they are able to minister by encouraging native pastors. John has also preached at one of the churches a couple times since it re-opened. They continue to be encouraged by the spiritual growth of these pastors and their congregations. Pray that these labors will continue to bear fruit.
- 26 Please pray for Chaplain Angel, a friend and colleague of USAF Chaplain S., Chaplain Angel has been ministering in a particularly difficult circumstance. Pray that the Lord would strengthen him in the task.
- 27 Please pray that when the church in Carlos Paz, Argentina is allowed to reconvene (current estimate is October or November) they will be able to find a meeting place. They gave up their previous place (which was inadequate) in order not to have the monthly rental during these months with no use.
- 28 Pray for wisdom for the ACU administration in Zambia about how to best serve the students through the re-opening of classes following the pandemic.
- 29 The Secrets ask that we pray they will be able to leave Peru within the next two months to begin their Home Ministry Assignment. They need to have their documents in order, store furniture, and find a flight.
- 30 Two Israeli churches requested videos of sermons from Baruch Maoz, which they broadcast in the place of in-person weekly services due to not being able to meet during the pandemic. Pray that God will use these videos in the lives of many.

31 Tim Wenger (Switzerland) thanks God for His protection during this time of COVID-19 in the Church of Neuchâtel, for the spiritual progress of several people, and for the re-starting of in-person activities.

## MISSIONARY PRAYER GUIDE



"For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea"

HABAKKUK 2:14

- 1 The brother with labors in the Far East requests prayer for a church history course for the training program there. It is being taught online this month in lieu of a live course which is not possible due to the cancellation of his normal summer trip there. Pray for sustaining strength, grace, and profit for all involved and for minimal technical difficulties which could be distractions. Please pray the same for all other courses that also must be done online during this period.
- 2 Jon Ryttersgarrd asks prayer for wisdom and a smooth process for CRBC Barbados as they are hoping to resume in-person Sunday worship services this month.
- 3 Tim Wenger (Switzerland) asks prayer for the biblical and sports training courses for young people, 16 years old and up, to be held July 4-11 in Geneva. A team, including Stefan Zürcher, Jérémie Cavin, and Tim Wenger of the Reformed Baptist Churches, will teach the 37 registered young people.
- 4 Pray for Valentin and his family, a student of the Brussels Bible school, who will do an internship with Olivier Favre (France) in July.
- 5 Please pray for the work the Selphs are doing in West Atlanta's inner-city. They are on the streets sharing food and gospel leaflets. They continue to be wonderfully embraced by the black community, despite the heightened racial tensions.
- 6 Please pray for USAF Chaplain G. and his wife as they transition into a new assignment and that they may find a local congregation to love and support. Also pray for their two sons to remain faithful to Christ as they "leave the nest".
- 7 The Wells (Italy) request prayer for Punto di Luce church as their new pastor has resigned. There is a lot of confusion and disappointment to be worked through. Pray for the church to remain strong in the unity of the faith. Pray, also, for a long-term pastor for the church who can lead skillfully and wisely.
- 8 USAF Chaplain S. requests prayer for the Johnson family who lost a son in June. Pray that they will know the comfort of Christ.
- 9 The congregation in Santiago, Chile (Pastor Obed Rupertus) requests prayer for several of their families who have lost their income due to the pandemic, including 2 from Venezuela, one from Peru, and one Chilean family. Also, families who previously had two incomes now have only one. Praise God: He has enabled the church to provide food and other necessities. Pray that the Lord will accomplish His holy will among them.
- 10 The brother with labors in Far East requests prayer for an online training program utilizing biblical counseling observation videos with local language subtitles. It is scheduled to be launched this month. This program will be following up a basic counseling training program which has already been completed by over 10,000 individuals. Please pray that this will be mightily used of the Lord to equip many to deal biblically with their own problems and to assist many others, while also helping to forward the process of establishing certification in biblical counseling in the local language.
- 11 Pray that the Masters (Argentiana) will see fruit from their various evangelistic outreaches.
- 12 Pray that the Kilians would use their time in the U.S. to be better prepared to minister to the students and faculty at ACU when they return to Zambia.
- 13 Pray for the Wells (Italy), as they have resumed pastoral responsibilities at Punto di Luce church due to their pastor stepping down. Pray that God would give them insight as to planning their future.
- 14 The Korties (Native Amer., AZ) report that the churches on the reservations have begun to re-open on a limited basis. However, some folks are still reluctant to attend, as the number of cases of COVID-19 is on the rise in Arizona. Pray for Pastors Jay Juan and Lee Miguel as they seek to minister to their folks in these unusual times.
- 15 Pray for God's blessing upon the Secrets' continued efforts to unite two like-minded works to form a new church plant in Peru. The core group will be made up of 31 adults with others waiting to join once they are organized.
- 16 Please pray for USAF Chaplain G. to have favor with his new leadership and fellow teammates.
- 17 Baruch Maoz reports that he is reviewing editorial comments on I and II Corinthians and greatly needs our prayers.
- 18 The Masters request prayer for Argentina's economy. Things have gotten very bad, again, and a lot of families are hurting.
- 19 Olivier Favre (France) requests prayer for Léa and Lévy, two young people who have applied for baptism. Pray that the Lord will strengthen them in their young faith. God willing, they will be baptized this fall.
- 20 The congregation in Carlos Paz, Argentina (Pastor Jorge Molina) is thankful that the COVID-19 situation, which left many out of work and needing assistance from the church, has improved. Some businesses have re-opened, returning some church members to their jobs and incomes.
- 21 Please pray for the Selph's Tuesday night Zoom Bible Study. There are now nine African-American ladies in the weekly study who are being taught the gospel from Ephesians.
- 22 Pastor Obed Rupertus (Santiago, Chile) is praising God for increased opportunities due to the pandemic: he's now preaching and teaching up to four times a day, giving needful counsel, and discipling many via Zoom. Also, his assistant Claudio has just completed the necessary studies and received his Diploma in Theology with William Carey Seminary in Argentina.
- 23 Pray for Pastor Jon Ryttersgaard and new deacon, Jonathan Alleyne, of CRBC Barbados to establish a good foundation of working together as fellow officers after Jonathan's recent appointment to the diaconate.
